Day of Departure

- Arrive at school 9.30 am
- Leave approx. 10 o'clock
- Arrive at Wrekin for lunch and walk up the hill
- Arrive at PGL at around 3.30pm
- Met by 'groupies' (Group Leaders)
- Site tour with fire drill
- Settle into dorms and tea!
- Evening activity



Accommodation



- The children will reside in the Mansion House during their stay.
- School staff are also housed in this building and always close at hand.
- The wash rooms are located near to the dormitories.
- There are separate girls and boys 'dorms' (8 in all).
- The dormitories will sleep between 4 and 12 children.
- The children sleep in bunk beds but will need a sleeping bag and a pillow case.





Daily meals

- Breakfast anything from cooked food to toast, cereals, fruit and yoghurts;
- Lunchtime choose from a variety of wraps, baguettes, burgers, pasta, salad, fruit...etc
- Evening meal range of cooked food and desserts including vegetarian options
- End of day hot chocolate, squash or water
- Special dietary requirements all needs can be met gluten/dairy-free, etc.





Activities

- Start at 7.30am and run through until 8.30pm in the evening
- There are two main activity sessions during the day, but the children's time is always being filled with games and other activities
- LIGHTS OUT! By 9.30pm





Night watch

- There are always members of staff on duty
- Hall Orchard staff will be in rooms close by
- Full-time nursing staff (24 hours of day)
- If your child should fall ill you will be notified
 by phone






Expectations

- We expect the children to represent the school whilst away and have the highest standard of behaviour.

Medical issues

- Medicine Administration forms will be issued in September and we will require details of any ailments
- Inhalers and medications any medication will need to be labelled clearly with name and dosage required





Kit list
