# Hall Orchard Barrow CE Primary School (Academy) Equality Information and Objectives Statement

## **Equality Objective 1:**

To close the gap in attainment between boys and girls for the 2019/20 Year 1 cohort in Reading, Writing and Maths as follows:

This will be achieved through regular monitoring and data analysis which in turn impacts on the curriculum provision to motivate and challenge boys.

The attendance between pupils with protective characteristics and non will improve year on year to meet a target of 96% by the end of academic year 2021/2022. This will be achieved through regular monitoring and data analysis.

### **Equality Objective 3:**

By the end of 2021/2022 pupils with protective characteristics will be accessing extra-curricular activities in-line with all pupils. This will be achieved through monitoring and data analysis, and organising extra-curricular activities to meet the needs and interests of identified pupils.
