Building work completion!

After what seems like an age, the building work has finally been completed.

This week we took charge of 4 sparkling new classrooms, an Arts Studio (for dance, drama and music), new toilets and a meeting room. Our Year 4 children are happiest of all as today they made the move from their temporary teaching bases to the new rooms—with 2 classes being upstairs and one down. This means that we will be able to take back the entire Hall space allowing whole school assemblies, school productions will return and we have two hall spaces for PE when the weather is too cold or wet to take the children outside.

Lunchtime arrangements will be also altered allowing both children having sandwiches and hot dinners to eat together—it also means no more eating in the classrooms for KS2. From Monday, the rear gates (Melton Road) will be open allowing dual access and this should hopefully reduce traffic congestion along Church Street.

Our Year 4 parents are invited to visit their children's new classrooms on Friday 26th at 3pm and we shall be opening up the entire space for parents on the February parents evenings.
