
A huge thank you for all your donations. We have raised an amazing £526.15! The eco-warriors will be discussing which sustainable projects we can use this money for soon.

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HOPS High 5

This week our whole-school reward system called HOPS **High 5**—based on our 5 core values was again celebrated. We've linked our school rules to these values so the children are rewarded for living them through their positive behaviours. They earn value points each time they demonstrate one of these values, with the overall aim of achieving enough points to receive a values badge. Interim certificates will be issued at regular milestones and weekly **Values Awards** are given out to children showing their commitment to the **value of the week**.



We were delighted to award our **Values Awards** in Assembly this week, with children from across the school receiving them for showing our Core Values. This week we focussed on *Thinking about our future* — looking at how we can protect the world for our futures. As part of this we celebrated Earth Day which was tremendous fun. Our children love to share their ideas and understand the importance of listening to the ideas of others. Well done to all those children who received awards (and also those who didn't!) for demonstrating any of our values in school this week!



Bronze and Silver Awards

This week we were pleased to announce more **Silver Award** winners alongside our Bronze Award winners! It was fantastic to celebrate the efforts of our Year 6 children who are a real credit to the school!

These children, and many others, are well on their way to

being the first of our **High 5** badge winners. Awesome stuff!



Getting to School Safely

With us having **530 pupils** at Hall Orchard, getting to and from school safely is an ongoing challenge.

The roads surrounding the school are not designed for the amount of vehicular traffic they receive,

immediately before and after school, and consequently there is an increased risk of an accident taking place. I would ask parents to be vigilant in reminding the children to look both ways when crossing driveways and roads, whether walking or cycling/scooting.

I would also request that, whenever possible, the children should walk to school—the exercise is an added benefit! If walking is out of the question, then could I suggest that parents park a little further away and walk the last part of the journey. Our friends at the Three Crowns (at the junction of Cotes Road/High Street) have said that parents can park in their car park whilst doing the school run. Car sharing is another great way of relieving congestion—and also a good way of sharing the dropping-off duties.

If you must drive, then please consider the safety and wellbeing of other road users, our neighbours and most importantly, our pupils, by adhering to a few guidelines:

- * drive slowly along the surrounding roads
- * do not drive or park on the pavement or across driveways
- * switch off engines whilst parked up
- * do not drive into or reverse into the main school entrance
- * act with consideration for others at all times.

If you are concerned about a car being driven or parked without care or attention around school, then I would suggest that you

report it to the Police and/or Leicestershire County Council, as the school has no power beyond the gates to do anything about it other than to ask respectfully for consideration for all users.

We spend a lot of time teaching our children about our values (including Community, Respect and Friendship) and we would hope that parents would share our ethos, even in the most testing of circumstances, such as at drop off and pick up after school!

The safety of our children is incredibly important and even if these strategies are only employed occasionally, it will make a great difference overall in improving the situation.

ONLINE CONTENT 10 tips to keep your children safe online

The internet has transformed the ability to access content. Many apps that children use are dependent on user-generated content which can encourage freedom of expression, imagination and creativity. However, due to the sheer volume uploaded every day, it can be difficult for platforms to regulate and moderate everything, which means that disturbing or distressing images, videos or audio clips can slip through the net. That's why we've created this guide to provide parents and carers with some useful tips on keeping children safe online.



MONITOR VIEWING HABITS

Whilst most apps have moderation tools, inappropriate content can still slip through the net.



CHECK ONLINE CONTENT

Understand what's being shared or what seems to be 'trending' at the moment.



Make sure they are old enough to use the app and meet the recommended age-limit.



Make accounts private and set content filters and parental controls where possible.



ENCOURAGE CRITICAL THINKING

Talk about what people might post online and why some posts could cause distress.





SPEND TIME ON THE APP

Get used to how apps work, what content is available and what your child likes to watch.



LEARN HOW TO REPORT & BLOCK

Always make sure that children know how to use the reporting tools on social media apps.



If a child has been affected by something they've seen online, seek support from your school's safeguarding lead.



LET CHILDREN KNOW YOU'RE THERE

Ensure they know that there is support and advice available to them if they need it.



If a child sees distressing material online; listen to their concerns, empathise and offer reassurance.



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
