


HOPS High 5

This week our whole-school reward system called HOPS **High 5**—based on our 5 core values was again celebrated. 

Walk to School Poster Competition NOTES FOR TEACHERS AND PARENTS

Hall Orchard Primary School and Barrow Greener Living Group are working in partnership to encourage healthier lifestyles and a greener village by organising a 'walk to school' poster competition. We want to promote walking to school as a good choice for the environment and for health and wellbeing. We would like pupils to join in with a poster competition with the aim of promoting this.

The posters could show that leaving the car at home is good for the planet or they could show that walking gives time to exercise, chat with family and friends, see nature and enjoy our village. They could show that less cars on the streets around Hall Orchard will improve the air we all breathe. Or the posters could be about how to make our streets feel safer to walk along by asking people to stop parking on the pavement or to switch off idling engines when they are parked. The posters could also show scooting and cycling too if these are a preferred way to travel actively without a car.

Winning posters will be selected and proudly displayed at the school and in other village buildings plus they will be published in Barrow Voice. Winners will also receive a certificate of achievement and a small prize. The children will be helping to start conversations about how to be greener and they will be inspiring others to embrace the benefits of walking, scooting and cycling and making the streets in Barrow upon Soar healthier and safer for everyone.

We have two age categories:

- Key Stage 1
- Key Stage 2

Submission Guidelines:

- · Use favourite art supplies (crayons, felt pens, paints etc) to create a masterpiece
- · Think about the themes of 'walking to school', 'no to pavement parking' and 'anti idling'
- · Poster size should be no larger than A4 (landscape or portrait)
- · Write your first name only plus class on the back of your poster
- · Submit your artwork to your class teacher no later than Thursday 16th May 2024
